DJ added that there is a hardship fund

	Concerns raised from Masters members about the proposed new swimming schedule:
	- The proposed move of the Tuesday Masters swim to 1 hour later would not work
	for them.
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- Moving the Thursday slot later would mean that this is not attractive to their members
- The earlier slot on a Tuesday has more than double the attendance
 The proposal to remove 1/3rd of their time and change their most popular session will have an impact, and they are likely to see a significant drop in members
- They have 45 members and none support the proposed changes
- Lack of consultation with Masters on the proposed changes

Reasons for the proposed changed explained

- the club needed to set up a new squad to swim alongside Club Squad
- Club squad session from 8:30pm to 9:30pm was at a bad time for the swimmers, and it is not reasonable for children to swim until 9:30pm
- Masters would get no loss of pool time
 At last week's meeting suggested to look at alternative evening slots or additional pool time, and this process has started

Following the meeting that had already taken place on the 18/2 covering the proposed changes the Exec Committee had already started the process to look at alternative evening slots or additional pool time.

As part of the discussion around this, Masters also expressed a willingness to support YCBC.
