Yearsley Swimming Pool and Energise Swimming Pool are the public pools we utilise.

All of these facilities employ Duty Managers and their own lifeguards. They are responsible for the EAP and NOP of their facility and our session leaders would in all instances raise the alarm and their protocols/procedures would take over.

Details of session / competition:

Monday – Yearsley pool – Training squads - National, County, Development, Club, Junior Club, Masters– morning and evening

Tuesday – Yearsley pool – Training squads – National, Regional, Club,

Wednesday – Yearsley Pool – Training Squads – National, Regional

Thursday – Yearlsey pool – Training Squads - National, Regional County, and Junior club squad. Energise pool – Club Squad.

Friday –Yearsley pool – Training Squads - National, Regional, County, Maters evening training.

Saturday – Yearsley pool – Training Squads - National, Regional, County.

Sunday – Energise – Training Squads - Development, Club, Junior Club

Facility: Yearsley Swimming Pool, Energise Swimming Pool.

Process for accident reporting:

Fill YCBC accident report (example on separate sheet) and facility accident book. Notify the Duty Manager and YCBC Secretary. All relevant YCBC workforce have access to blank copies.

As outlined in the facility emergency action plan (EAP) what action should be taken in the event of an emergency? :

In the event of an incident raise the alarm by notifying the nearest Lifeguard. The relevant emergency services will then be contacted by the Duty Manager.

When the fire alarm sounds all pool users must listen to the lifeguards instructions, get out and go through the nearest fire exit to meet outside for a register to be taken by the YCBC coach.

Details of where the emergency contact details of swimmers and volunteers helping in the session are held:

Emergency contact details are held with the secretary for all swimmers and volunteers. The coaches also have emergency contact details and medical information. These are updated every time a swimmer moves squads.

Identify the location of the facility first aid kit and phone to use in case of emergency:

Lifeguards/Duty Managers will access as appropriate.

All YCBC service providers carry a mobile first aid kit with them at all times.
